Question 1 on the ballot includes a request for \$1.5 million per year for 10 years to provide and maintain classroom technology resources and infrastructure.

If approved, capital funding would support:

Enhanced Learning

Provide digital tools/resources to enhance how students learn by:

- Personalizing learning to meet the needs of all students
- Supporting collaboration among students and teachers
- Allowing anywhere, anytime teaching and learning

Equitable Access

Provide the infrastructure and support needed for our schools by:

- Providing increased, equitable access to digital tools for all grade levels and subject areas
- Providing training and support for students and teachers
- Maintaining a robust, reliable technology infrastructure

Future Readiness

Develop future ready students by:

- Learning and working in ways that reflect real-world work environments
- Developing skills needed for further education and future careers

Lakeville Area Public Schools is committed to personalizing learning and developing future-ready students. Our vision is focused not on technology itself, but on its use as a tool to enhance and improve the teaching and learning process. Our goal is *not* to be a “one-to-one” or technology-dependent district.
