Improved **Safety and Security**

- Enhanced visitor management system and secure entryways
- Upgraded internal security system, including door controls and lockdown capabilities
- Enhanced video monitoring



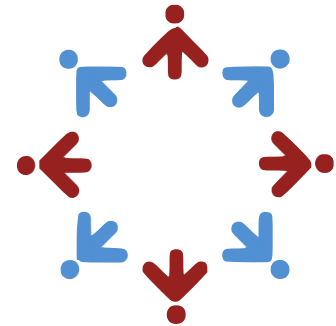
Increased **Access to STEM Learning**

- Engaging Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math resources in all grade levels
- Access to STEM programming for all students
- Comprehensive K-12 STEM program



Increased **Access to Digital Tools for Learning**

- Increased access to digital tools by providing sharable sets of devices for each grade level or subject area team
- Updated core technology (update aging computer labs and infrastructure)
- Support for a balance of traditional and digital teaching and learning approaches

Question 2: Additional Operating Levy



Lower **High School Class Sizes**

- 6 additional teachers in core high school subjects (Math, English Language Arts, Science, Social Studies)
- 1 Career Pathways teacher



Restore **Elementary Art Programming**

- 5 Elementary Art Specialists
- One hour of art per week for students in Grades 1-5



Restore **5th Grade Band**

- 2.2 Elementary Band teachers
- Before or after school opportunity for Grade 5 Band

How Much Would This Cost?

- Approval of both questions would result in a total tax impact of approximately \$10 per month to the owner of an average-value home (\$257,000) in Independent School District 194.
